



Scavenger Hunt

Best Use

To help children get to know their father better through the clues provided to complete the scavenger hunt. For children who do not live with their dad, you can substitute the name of a foster parent, grandparent, or another significant person in their life.

Value

Hold a scavenger hunt as a way for your family to celebrate dad or another significant person in your child's life

Advance Preparation

- Ensure you have a Bible on hand
- Plan a time for your family to gather for a fun scavenger hunt in honor of Father's Day
- Give Dad the questions in advance so he has time to think of his favorite/least favorite things

Game Plan

Gather the family and read Ephesians 6:2. Encourage kids to remember what they learn about Dad and use it to honor him in special ways. Perhaps they could use his favorite color when they color a picture for her or offer to help with his least favorite chore. They can prepare his favorite food or make up a story about her favorite animal. Encourage your family to honor Dad every day, and not just on Father's Day.

1. Find something about as tall as Dad.
2. Find something that starts with the same first letter as Dad's favorite movie.
3. Find something related to a chore Dad's doesn't like.
4. Find an ingredient from one of Dad's favorite foods.
5. Find something about as big as Dad's favorite animal.
6. Find something that Dad likes to talk or think about.
7. Find 3 things that are Dad's favorite color.
8. Find something Dad uses every day.
9. Find something that reminds Dad of his favorite game.
10. Find something you could do to honor Dad every day.

Prayer: Have someone close in prayer, thanking God for blessing your lives through Dad and asking Him to help you find ways to honor him throughout the year, not just on Father's Day.



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
